Dollars for Missions

Central Illinois District encourages its congregations to invite their members to contribute one dollar per member per week for missions, in addition to their ordinary offerings. This kind of over-and-above giving is called "A Dollar for Missions" (DFM). A Dollar for Missions gathers many small gifts - one dollar at a time! - to add up to a big impact for the spread of the saving Gospel of Christ. DFM presents us all with a wonderful prospect. Each member contributing one extra dollar every week can result in significant sums for new missions and mission augmentation.

The current "Dollar for Missions" project is \$35,000 for a 12 passenger van for the University Lutheran Church in Champaign. This van will have two major uses: as a shuttle for students on Sunday mornings, and for transportation to various activities, retreats, and service projects throughout the year. Elizabeth Deverman is a student at the University so this particular DFM project will be of benefit to her.

As of June 30, DFM has received \$14,607.20. In other words, almost halfway through 2023, DFM has received considerably less than half of the money necessary to fund this particular project. There is a container under the screen in Room 10 to put your dollars in.

Last month Trinity had a new drinking fountain installed. This drinking fountain is also a bottle filling station which will reduce the amount of bottled water we use and has a built in water filter.



Witness to "De-Churched" Neighbors through the Lens of Idolatry

Beloved in the Lord,

"I don't need to go to church to be Christian. I believe in God but worship Him in my own way."

Many of us have heard similar phrases from our "de-churched" family, friends, or neighbors. It's often hard for us to respond. This isn't only because we might be too timid or nervous to confront the error. It might also be because we're not sure how to respond even if we had the courage to do so.

In one way, these sorts of phrases might make sense to us. "Huh, maybe he's right. After all, we aren't saved by our works, which include attending church on Sunday morning. We are saved by grace through faith. So, maybe I'm wrong to be concerned about my neighbor's lack of church attendance..."

But you are not wrong to be concerned, Christian. Yes, we are saved through faith in Christ, but that faith is both received and exercised in a *particular*, *God-ordained* way. So, continue to be concerned for your de-churched, inactive neighbor. Continue to pray for him. Continue to listen and try to have conversations about this with her. Continue to encourage your friend back to church!

Perhaps one way in which to expose gently the error of "I don't need Church" is to use the lens of idolatry. Let me explain using a well-known story from the Bible: the incident of the golden calf. In Exodus 32 we find Israel at the foot of Mount Sinai. Moses has been up on the mountain for quite some time, and the children of Israel grow impatient. They demand of Aaron, Moses' brother, "Come, make us gods that shall go before us." Aaron obliges and makes a golden calf out of the people's golden earrings. However, after he has produced this idol, Aaron doesn't say, "Forget about the LORD, who brought you up out of Egypt." He says, "This is your god, O Israel, that brought you out of the land of Egypt! ... Tomorrow is a feast to the LORD."

Did you notice what Aaron did? He invites the people to worship the LORD, the true God, but by means of a false idol. In other words, Aaron and the people are still claiming to worship the true God, but they are attempting to do so through their own self-devised means. We only need read the aftermath of this incident to see how the Lord regards such attempts.

The Lord has a particular way in which He desires His people to receive from Him and worship Him. In the Old Testament, this was through the Tabernacle (later the Temple) and His sacrificial system (not through a golden calf!). In the New Testament it is through the Lord Jesus Christ as we hear His Word and receive His Sacraments together. Anything outside of this is idolatry—false worship.

I'm not suggesting that helping your de-churched neighbor to recognize this "the silver bullet" for getting him or her back to church. What it will do, if you're demonstrate this patiently from God's Word, is leave your neighbor to wrestle with God's Law. Through this the Holy Spirit will do His work in the person's heart and mind. It will confront your neighbor's error and open the way for repentance!
