Beloved in the Lord,

Wrapping up the brief series on Frequently Asked Questions about Closed Communion, I would like to address the question What is the history of Closed Communion in the Church? The following excerpts come from the book *Come in, We are Closed* by Rev. Tyrel Bramwell (a very accessible book which I recommend for further reading on this topic). They give a brief description of what the early church practiced and why.

What we call closed Communion is the Church's historic practice... On the night Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper, we see that it was a private event our Lord hosted in the upper room for His closest followers, the twelve disciples. Today, many churches don't revere the Sacrament as they should, but not so with the early Church. In the first centuries of Christianity, if you were not a member of the Church, you could come to hear the Bible readings, sing hymns, listen to the sermon, and pray, but not even those who were being instructed in the Faith could attend the Service of the Sacrament. Anyone with an unconfirmed faith had to leave. The doors of the church would be closed and even guarded... We get the term closed Communion from the closed doors.

If you wanted to take Communion, the clergy needed to know you... Of course, the local pastors knew who was under their care... [If traveling] visitors would declare which church they belonged to. If it was an orthodox ["right opinion" or "right praise] church, and they were in good standing, of course they could receive Communion... Communicant members in good standing are those who have been taught the Faith and repent of their sins. When those folks knew they would be traveling they could acquire a letter from their pastor to present to the church they would be visiting. If a person came from a church that taught something other than what the Scripture taught, they weren't allowed to Commune. Only orthodox Christians commune at orthodox churches.

Closed Communion wasn't so much about restricting participation [that was not its end goal], but about teaching truth-orthodoxy.

This past Sunday we commemorated the Presentation of the Augsburg Confession on June 25, 1530. Interestingly, one of the constant themes of our Lutheran Confessions, in addition to "This is what the Scriptures teach, so this is what we believe" was the constant refrain "See, what we believe and do is what the Church has always believed and done. This is nothing new!" Likewise, the practice of Closed Communion, though unpopular in our day, is nothing new. The Church has practiced it since the beginning, and for good reason! The concern of Closed Communion is both right reception of our Lord's body and blood as well as right confession of His Word. It is that word, rightly preached and confessed, that is able to save our souls and those of our neighbors.

Auction News

Thank you to all who helped make Good Shepherd Lutheran School's 17th Annual Benefit Auction, *"Run for the Roses with Ewe!"* another outstanding evening! Once again, we greatly appreciate all of you who bought tickets and attended, donated items, services, or gift cards, sponsored tables, or prayed for our school and our auction. Together we again reached goals we thought were only dreams!

Now that all bills have been received, and most matching donations have come in, the Auction Committee can announce our totals! Our Gross Profit was an astounding \$181,319.00! After bills of \$31,311.64 have been paid, the net profit for Good Shepherd Lutheran School is \$150,007.36!

The Building Fund will receive \$44,272.63 which will cover three months of mortgage payments! This year's Fund-An-Item is a lump-sum payment to reduce the mortgage, and this astronomical total is \$105,734.73!! This one-time principal payment will shorten the school's loan by over 13 months and will save the school approximately \$62,000.00 in interest! The grand total net profit over the past 17 years is a whopping \$1,536,990.35!! Praise God from Whom all Blessings Flow!

This year's committee will meet one final time to address and mail thank you letters. The new committee will take a few months off before they begin meeting again to plan the 18th auction for 2024!




