Giving in January was slightly more than what was projected, while expenses were right on budget. The General Fund balance at the end of January was \$174,320.

In January the Voters Assembly approved a budget for 2023 of approximately \$320,000. \$40,000 of this amount is targeted for Capital Improvements. These Capital Improvement projects will need to be approved at a later date once the plans have been finalized. Projected giving in 2023 is approximately \$251,500. General Fund reserves will be used to fund expenses incurred over and above giving.

Let us give thanks to the Lord for His continued blessings and pray that we may continue to be faithful stewards until the day of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

An informational meeting will begin at 6:00 p.m. An open house will follow the meeting.



"Shrove Tuesday" (The Day Before Ash Wednesday)

Beloved in the Lord,

Did you "give something up" for Lent? "Giving something up" is based on the Biblical practice of "fasting." Strictly speaking, "fasting" means to go without food for a time. Giving up or limiting one particular thing (sugar, alcohol, TV, Facebook, etc.) is what's called "abstinence."

Throughout Scripture God's people fasted—sometimes while they prayed, sometimes as part of their repentance. Israel fasted when a king died or in remembrance of a national tragedy. As we read Scripture, we see that fasting is an assumed practice for God's people.

**Do we fast?** Growing up, I didn't know too much about fasting. I knew *what* it was (not eating), and I recall my father encouraging me to try it one Holy Week. I don't think I really "got the point", though, and from experience it seems that many Christians are in the same boat.

Whatever the reason for the lack of fasting these days, what does our Lord say? He says, "Whenever you fast..." (Matt. 6:16). Did you catch that? Whenever? He doesn't prescribe when or how (except how not to do it), but He does assume that we will (esp. after his ascension; see Matt. 9:15).

But why fast? The Lord gives us a hint: "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth... But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven..." (Matt. 6:19-20). Fasting can help loosen the grip which earthly pleasure and treasure has on our hearts so that our hearts might be fixed on the heavenly treasure: Christ and His Word. With fasting we remind ourselves that Christ is more important than food or pleasure. There's more to fasting than that (e.g., it aids in self-control, saves time, focus, and money for prayer and almsgiving [mercy work]), but that's the heart of it.

So, how might you start? First, don't overdo it. If your doctor cautions against it or you're a nursing mother, maybe give up something other than food. Never fasted? Start small. Pick a day (traditional days were Wednesdays and Fridays). Try skipping just one meal, then slowly build from there. Adjust what you need to as you go. Use any time saved to pray, examine yourself, read Scripture, or serve your neighbor. Can't fast from a full meal? Give up something (food or otherwise) in which you overindulge or that hinders your Christian walk. You might fast on Sunday morning, letting the first thing that enters your mouth be Christ's Body and Blood. Instead of eating, meditate upon what it is you are about to receive.

Whatever you do, make a plan. Pray that God would help you and bless you through it. If you'd like some more guidance, talk to your pastor! May the Lord bless you this Lententide.

#### **Individual Confession and Absolution**

Beginning Saturday, February 25th, Pastor Raddatz will be available every Saturday throughout the Season of Lent (including Easter Eve) from 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. for Individual Confession and Absolution. Simply enter through the back doors (into Room 10) and make your way to the nave. If someone is already at the altar with Pastor, please wait in the back chapel. If not, you may approach the altar reverently and kneel (or stand) at the altar rail. Pastor Raddatz will guide you through the rite for Individual Confession and Absolution.

#### From Luther's Small Catechism

*What is Confession?* Confession has two parts. First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven.

What sins should I confess? Before God we should plead guilty of all sins, even those we are not aware of, as we do in the Lord's prayer, but before the pastor we should confess only those sins which we know and feel in our hearts.
