The "Moms Who Care" program is available at Edison Junior High, Broadmoor Junior High, and Wilson Intermediate schools. Moms Who Care is now a total of 13 junior high and high schools in Central Illinois. They are funded by donations, in-kind and monetary. On average, 800 students per month are helped. Students "shop" for the things they need, like basic hygiene products, snacks, and school supplies. Monetary donations are used to purchase specific items such as work clothing, tennis shoes, and essential items that are not in the shopping room. In March, Trinity provided a donation of \$250.00 each to Edison, Broadmoor, and Wilson schools for Moms Who Care to help further their assistance to kids in need.



April 25, 2023 Tuesday—The 3rd Week of Easter

Beloved in the Lord,

I often receive questions regarding Trinity's communion practice—who may or may not commune at Trinity's altar. So, I would like to answer some of these questions and concerns as clearly and faithfully as I can with the Holy Scriptures. To that end I will use this newsletter and the next few to address some **Frequently Asked Questions about "Closed Communion**" (a term which I will define as we go along).

First, let's review: What is the Lord's Supper? "It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine instituted by Christ Himself for us Christians to eat and to drink" (*Luther's Small Catechism*). This is an article of faith. We believe it simply because Christ promises it with His own words. Therefore, *anyone* who comes to the Lord's Table will receive the very body and blood of Christ, given and shed at the cross.

Second, Jesus teaches us what this eating and drinking is for: the forgiveness of sins. When you receive the body and blood of Christ with a repentant heart, trusting in Jesus' words, you have exactly what He says: forgiveness of your sins (and thus certainty of your standing before God)! If this is so, *then wouldn't we want everyone who visits our church to receive the Lord's Supper?*

Well, although the Lord *intends* the Lord's Supper for our good, that does not mean that it can *never* be received in a way that is harmful. St. Paul writes, "For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself" (1 Cor. 11:29).

What is Paul saying? Anyone who does not "discern," or "judge" that the body [and blood] of Christ are truly present in the bread [and wine] of the Lord's Supper, "eats and drinks judgment on himself." That is, if someone does not receive or believe that he receives more than mere bread and wine in the Lord's Supper, he does not receive Christ in the right manner there. In fact, according to this passage (and as the context shows), he even invites God's judgment and discipline upon himself! An analogy might be helpful here: The Lord's Supper might be compared to prescription medicine. Such medicine is *intended* for a good purpose, but not everyone who takes it will benefit from it. For example, some may take it without a prescription, in which case it may be harmful! It is similar with the Lord's Supper.

Our communion practice, then, is an exercise of our responsibility to love our neighbor who comes to the Divine Service. We want to ensure to the best of our ability that he partakes of the body and blood of Christ, not to his harm, but to his spiritual well-being! In other words, our communion practice of admitting some but not others—however uncomfortable it may be—is truly an act of love and spiritual care.

I recognize that this only scratches the surface of our practice. In the next article I will aim to address further questions, such as: What if someone believes in the real presence of Christ in the Sacrament but isn't Lutheran? Shouldn't that person be welcomed to partake at our altar?

Until then, the peace of Christ be with you all.


May Food Drive

This year's Fund-An-Item will be a Principal Reduction Payment on our building loan. We still owe \$1,302,881.00 and have 11.2 years left on the loan. The school cannot consider any building projects, including a gym, until the current building debt is retired. We hope to significantly reduce this debt and the time left through this year's Auction Fund-An-Item!

Here are some numbers to consider:

If we raise \$10,000 -	we shorten the loan by 1 month and save \$6,539 in interest
If we raise \$20,000 -	we shorten the loan by 3 months and save \$12,999 in interest
If we raise \$30,000 -	we shorten the loan by 4 months and save \$19,367 in interest
If we raise \$40,000 -	we shorten the loan by 5 months and save \$25,659 in interest
If we raise \$60,000 -	we shorten the loan by 7 months and save \$38,005 in interest
If we raise \$70,000 -	we shorten the loan by 9 months and save \$44,057 in interest
If we raise \$80,000 -	we shorten the loan by 10 months and save \$50,033 in interest
If we raise \$90,000 -	we shorten the loan by 12 months and save \$55,929 in interest
If we raise \$100,000 -	we shorten the loan by 13 months and save \$61,743 in interest
If we raise \$250,000 -	we shorten the loan by 31 months and save \$140,253 in interest
If we raise \$500,000 -	we shorten the loan by 59 months and save \$238,748 in interest

Or we could raise the full \$1,302,881.00 and have the debt retired!!!


