From the Pastor's Desk

"Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, saying, 'Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we have seen his star when it rose and have come to worship him.'" Matthew 2:1-2

Dear Members of Trinity,

On the first day of Christmas, my true love gave to me...

Yes, I know that it's January. But if you get this before January 6th, we are still celebrating the Twelve Days of Christmas. It seems to me that everyone is excited each year for Christmas Day to arrive. Stores seem to put up Christmas decorations earlier and earlier each year (you might have seen them going up around Halloween). Radio stations like WCIC (a Christian radio station) start to play Christmas music the day after Thanksgiving until December 25th.

But then what happens? By December 26th, people are already taking down their Christmas lights and tossing their Christmas trees to the curb (people with artificial trees might take a little longer). Department stores celebrate the holidays with their "after Christmas sales".

But for the Church, Christmas has only just begun! The Twelve Days of Christmas that we sing about in the song START with December 25th and END on January 5th. There are other minor festivals that start off the 12 days including the Feast of St. Stephen on December 26th (remember "Good King Wenceslas"?); The Feast of St. John, Apostle and Evangelist on December 27th; and the Feast of the Holy Innocents (dedicated to the boys two and under who were slaughtered by King Herod) on December 28th. We also observe the Circumcision and Name of Jesus on New Year's (the 8th day of Christmas).

On January 6th, we observe the Feast of Epiphany. In the Eastern Orthodox Church Epiphany is known as the "Gentiles' Christmas" because they celebrate the arrival of the Magi who travelled from the East to worship Jesus and bring him gifts. They followed the light of the star, which led them to the Light of the World (with a slight delay in Jerusalem).

The word "Epiphany" is translated from the Greek, and it means "manifest". You may know the hymn "Songs of Thankfulness and Praise," which ends with "God in man made manifest". The word Epiphany is a word picture. I used to ask my confirmands (or sometimes younger children in a Childrens' Message) "What do you need to take a picture?" I'd get all sorts of answers, from a camera, film or a subject for the picture. But the most important thing you need for a picture is *light*. Without light, it doesn't matter if you use a camera with film, a digital camera, or even your cell phone these days, you aren't going to get a picture. The shutter of a camera gradually opens and lets in the light. In the season of Epiphany, the light of Jesus Christ starts small (a star) and gradually increases as we see Jesus made manifest at His baptism, in His miracles and ministry, until finally we see Him in His full glory on the Feast of the Transfiguration. The season of Epiphany is a glorious opportunity for us to "see the Light" even as the daylight hours outside grow longer beginning with Christmas and continuing through Epiphany.

May we continue to worship our Lord, the Light of the World through Christmas, Epiphany, and thr rest of the year. And may God bless you throughout the coming year.
