Giving in January was significantly lower than was projected most likely due to low attendance on two Sundays that were extremely cold. It is anticipated that February giving will make up for January. January expenses were a bit higher than budgeted mainly due to a large insurance bill paid in January. The General Fund balance at the end of January was \$212,428.

### **Endowment Fund**

The Endowment Fund received a gift of \$10,000 in January. Since its inception in 2001, \$109,470 has been gifted to the Endowment Fund. From the earnings over the years, \$33,493 has been granted to various organizations as recommended by the Church Council. At the end of 2023, \$24,390 of unspent earnings was available for additional grants.

Let us give thanks to the Lord for His continued blessings and pray that we may continue to be faithful stewards until the day of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

## **Personal Care Kits**

The Boards of Christian Service / Evangelism are hosting a service project during the Season of Lent. Personal Care Kits provides much needed self-care, critical germ fighting, and the chance to regain dignity amidst situations of fear and uncertainty. They are used for those who must flee their home due to a natural disaster or those arriving in a refugee camp. The items listed below are needed to make a Personal Care Kit:

- ► One lightweight cotton or cotton blend bath-size towel (20" x 40" to 52" x 27") dark color recommended
- ► Two or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 9 oz, any brand, in original wrapping
- One adult size toothbrush in its original packaging (no toothpaste)
- One sturdy comb. There are many different types of hair texture, so no picks or fine-toothed combs (remove packaging)
- One metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

If you would like to donate just mark a pew envelope "Personal Care Kits," otherwise you can bring your items to the church and put them in the box in Room 10. # From the Pastor's Desk

"The women who had come with Him from Galilee followed and saw the tomb and how His body was laid. Then they returned and prepared spices and ointments.

On the Sabbath they rested according to the commandment.

Luke 23:55-56

Dear Members of Trinity,

This month, we are observing the season of Lent. At the end of March, the Church observes Holy Week and the Triduum, ending with Easter/the Feast of the resurrection which falls this year on March 31<sup>st</sup>. Let's take a short time to review what happens as the Church Lent, Holy Week and Easter.

Palm Sunday (March 24<sup>th</sup>) is observed on the Lord's Day before Easter. It is the day of Holy Week when our Lord Jesus came into Jerusalem riding on a donkey. The disciples and the crowds laid their cloaks as well as palm branches at their feet. Certainly, in Jesus' day, it brought to mind King Solomon entering into Jerusalem on a donkey as the crowds are shouting: "Hosanna in the highest! Hosanna to the son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" Today it also reminds us of the book of Revelation, where the apostle John records: "After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice..."

The next day we usually observe is *Maundy Thursday*. Maundy is from the Latin "mandatum" or commandment, which reminds us the words Jesus spoke to His disciples in the Upper Room, saying: "This is my *commandment*, that you love one another." Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper with His disciples as He prepared for His suffering, passion and death to come. The service doesn't end as part of the Triduum or three-day journey and the altar is stripped while the members of the congregation exit in silence.

The Church then goes to *Good Friday*, as we follow Jesus' along the *Via Dolorosa*, or "way of tears" to the cross and Mount Calvary. It is on the cross that Jesus' speaks His Seven Words of the cross before He gives up His spirit, having paid the price for our sins with His innocent suffering and death. In the Chief Service (also known as the *Tenebrae* service), the church is gradually darkened and the Christ Candle is removed and the *strepitus*, the sound of the stone being rolled in front of the tomb, is heard. The congregation once again exits the church in silence.

The Triduum ends with Holy Saturday, the day of the great *Easter Vigil*. In the time of the early Christian Church, when more adults were converted to Christianity, the Church would spend the season of Lent in catechesis (instruction) and new members would be baptized on Holy Saturday. They would then keep vigil, like the women who prepared spices to embalm Jesus' body and waited until Sunday morning to bring them to the tomb. The new converts would then celebrate Easter Sunrise and receive communion for the first time. Today, the Church still celebrates the Easter Vigil (even Lutherans) in preparation for the Feast of the Resurrection. The Vigil ends with the Benediction.

Finally, of course, we celebrate Jesus' joyous resurrection on *Easter Sunday*. We rejoice that Jesus not only died for us, but also rose from the dead to seal the victory that He won for us upon the cross. Just as Jonah spent three days in the belly of the great fish, so also Jesus spent three days in the belly of the tomb until He rose again. May we all celebrate this Easter triumph, and may we continue to prepare our hearts and minds throughout the remainder of this Lenten season.
