## 2024 Advent Devotions

Christmastime is when we look again to God's great love and mercy. It is when we consider Jesus' lowly birth - God coming to us a Child - and marvel at a love so freely given to a world so hostile and corrupt. There is really no response possible other than "Come, Let Us Adore Him!" At Christmas, God has come to us in His Son. Truly "This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it!"

#### From the Pastor's Desk

"In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David, and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land." Jeremiah 33:15

Dear Members of Trinity,

Cyprian was an African bishop who lived in Carthage during the middle of the third century. He and his people lived during a difficult period in the history of the Roman Empire and in the life of the church. You see, there was a plague in 250 A. D. that devastated the population of the empire, and to add insult to injury, the Romans *blamed the Christians* for the calamity because the Christians refused to worship the Roman Gods and preserve the *pax deorum* ("the peace of the gods"). This unleashed a deadly persecution under the Emperor Decius that claimed many Christian lives and devastated those who survived. The same thing happened to Christians in Rome nearly one hundred years earlier when Rome burned during the reign of Emperor Nero.

The Christians were blamed because they refused to deny their Lord even in the face of torture and death. They lived blameless lives before the Lord but not before the world. Jesus had warned His disciples (and us) that the world would hate them for this, because it hated Him. Jesus went blameless to the cross and "was pierced for our transgressions; He was crushed for our iniquities" (Isaiah 53:5). Just as our Lord was innocent and blameless when He took up His cross, so also Christians can strive to be innocent and blameless in a world that is opposed to our Lord (John 16:33) and that we will be vindicated at His coming back.

It seems, these days, that hostility towards Christians is increasing even here in the United States. Several communities have removed Nativity Scenes from the public square. Store employees have been told to wish people "Season's Greetings" or "Happy Holidays" instead of "Merry Christmas". Political correctness has forced schools and work to eliminate Christmas Concerts, Christmas office parties, etc. The "separation of church and state" has taken on a whole new meaning today. The term "freedom of religion" has been exchanged for "freedom of worship", as if we need to keep our faith within the walls of the church.

Advent and Christmas are the time when we are in our darkest times. The daylight hours get shorter and shorter until Christmas Eve (shortly after the Winter Solstice) when the daylight hours become noticeably longer for the first time. Isaiah spoke of "the people who walk in darkness have seen a great light". When things around us seem the darkest, when we are tempted to despair, I pray that we look all the more firmly to Jesus Christ, who is the light of the world.

I also pray that we may all celebrate these days in worship at Trinity, or wherever we may go on vacation. Look to the light of Christ, especially as times of persecution and trouble seem their darkest for us these days. May God bless us and keep us, and may you all have a Merry Christmas.
