Giving in August was close to what was projected, but it is off approximately \$10,700 year to date. Expenses were much lower than what was budgeted, mostly due to having assumed a full time Pastor would be on board by the first of July. Year to date giving has exceeded expenses by \$20,916 resulting in a General Fund balance at the end of July of \$249,435.

At the July church council meeting two "large" unbudgeted expenses were approved totaling over \$5,000: 1. Roof repair and 2. New riding lawn mower. In August \$4,950 was approved to fill cracks and seal the parking lot. In addition, estimates are being put together to renovate both bathrooms in the Parsonage.

Trinity is in a good position to absorb these unbudgeted expenses thanks to the abundant blessings from our God.

Let us give thanks to the Lord for His continued blessings and pray that we may continue to be faithful stewards until the day of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

## Life Chain Sunday, October 6 2:00 p.m.

Lutherans for Life will again participate in the **Life Chain on Sunday, October 6, 2024.** This will take place at the Planned Parenthood facility at 2709 N. Knoxville Ave in Peoria and stretch north and south from there along Knoxville. We will gather there at 2:00 p.m. and quietly stand for one hour along both sides of the street holding signs provided by Central Illinois Right to Life. Life Chain is a peaceful and prayerful public witness of pro-life. Americans standing for one hour praying for our nation and for an end to abortion. It is a visual statement of solidarity by the Christian community that abortion kills children and tat the Church supports the sanctity of human life from the moment of conception.

## From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Members of Trinity,

I have been serving as your vacancy pastor for almost a year now. It has been a privilege and pleasure to serve you. This past September 5<sup>th</sup>, in your Special Voters' Meeting, you voted to call me to serve you as your full-time pastor here at Trinity. On Monday, September 16<sup>th</sup> (which also happened to be my youngest daughter Joy's 14<sup>th</sup> birthday), I received the official documents of the call for me to examine and pray over.

You might think that this is a slam dunk for me to accept this call, but I am obliged to tell you that nothing is easy. I shall be spending the next week or two wrestling with the Lord in prayer as I consider this call to serve. I also covet your prayers for me and for my family as we consider this important call to serve at Trinity.

What should you pray for? Pray for God's guidance in deliberation of this call. Do not assume that if I accept this call that my wife and kids will transfer their membership from Bethel to Trinity. My wife is a called teacher at Bethel, and my two youngest daughters attend school at Bethel (elementary and high school). My youngest is going to be confirmed at Bethel and is graduating from the school. Their friends are at Bethel, and it would be unfair to uproot them at this stage in their lives. It was difficult enough when we did it seven years ago when they were much younger. Our oldest daughter, Grace, is attending college at Concordia University in Seward, NE. She would be graduating in few years and would not be affected by this decision anyway. Will they visit or attend worship at Trinity? Possibly, on rare occasions, but their church home will remain at Bethel as long as they are in elementary school and high school. Thank you for your prayers and understanding.

Pray as well for my continued health and safety (those of you who remember what happened during Holy Week can appreciate this request). It has now been over a year since I had my last chemotherapy treatment, and thus far, I have had a clean bill of health and am in full remission. It is my prayer that I don't have a relapse any time soon.

By the time you get this, I should have reached a decision on the call. This will have been done prayerfully, thoughtfully, with everyone involved taken into consideration. Thank you for your prayers and your support.

**Amount to be Funded:** \$25,000 (currently half-funded)

Project: Replace furnaces at Immanuel Lutheran Student Center, Macomb

Church services are held at 11:00 a.m. every Sunday in the student center's Chapel of St. Timothy the Learner. Students and members of Immanuel Lutheran Church, CID's partner in campus ministry in Macomb. On Wednesday evenings, students are invited to meals prepared by church member families in the student center kitchen prior to a weekly Bible study session also in the student center. The pastor's office and church office for Immanuel Macomb are located in the center and highly accessible to students.

The student center celebrated its 50th anniversary some five years ago. Now, the furnaces need to be replaced. The current Dollar for Missions project will provide \$25,000 for furnace replacement to keep the student center operational for years. Donations can be put in the container in the back of the sanctuary.


