The General Fund balance at the end of February was 251,187.65.

From the Pastor's Desk

"And Mary said, 'Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word.' And the angel departed from her." Luke 1:38

Dear Members of Trinity,

Easter, or the Feast of the Resurrection, is just around the corner. So you might very well be wondering, "Why does Pastor Drews think that we are celebrating Christmas?"

Good question!

Actually, by the time you get this Newsletter, we will have just passed a different church festival that will probably be closer than Easter is. You see, on March 25th of every year, the church celebrates the Feast of the Annunciation to Mary,

"What's that?" you may very well ask. What is the Annunciation to Mary? The Annunciation is the date when the Angel Gabriel "announced" to Mary, the Mother of Jesus, that she would be the Mother of God... And nine months later (the amount of time most women are pregnant before they deliver a baby)... we celebrate Jesus birth.

Mary was given the glorious, good news that she was going to have a baby and name Him "Jesus" or savior. This wasn't just good news for Mary. It's good news for us all! We know that the birth of the Messiah is good news to us. But we don't just celebrate His birthday. And it's certainly not the most important thing we celebrate, either.

Throughout the season of Lent, we observe a time of repentance and renewal as we look forward to the Passion of our Lord. We follow our Lord to His entrance into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, when He instituted the Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday, we watch Him suffer hell and death on the cross on Good Friday, and wait in Vigil on Holy Sunday. We also need to remember that all of these things: Jesus' birth, His Passion, His death, mean absolutely nothing without the Resurrection of our Lord.

Perhaps that's why this seemingly small and insignificant feast of the Annunciation is more important than we might think. Here's why:

Did you ever wonder why the Church have lilies on Easter? Originally, in the early Christian Church (before there were labels like "Catholic", "Orthodox", or even "Lutheran"), they would celebrate the Annunciation to Mary by placing "Madonna lilies" on and around the altar to celebrate the festival. As you may know, Easter is NOT celebrated the same time every year (it's quite late this year). At times, Easter can fall as early as March 23. So when people came to worship on Easter, but didn't realize that the Annunciation of Mary was being celebrated some time around Easter, they saw the lilies and began to associate them with the Easter season.

Whatever the reason for why we use lilies, we can certainly use them as a reminder of BOTH of these holy days. We can rejoice with the Apostles' Creed that our Lord was "conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and buried." And especially, as we do every Lord's Day, we can celebrate a "mini-Easter" day when we gather at the Lord's Table. May we do so often.

Plumbing, painting, and yes, tuck pointing, need to be done periodically if CID is to continue providing this place where the Gospel has been preached and the sacraments administered on the University of Illinois campus for more than 70 years.
