Giving in December was close to projections and finished \$5,733 less than what was projected. Expenses were on budget and finished \$30,221 less than budgeted for the year. Year to date giving exceeded expenses by \$23,873 resulting in a General Fund balance at the end of December of \$266,571.

Estates and Bequests

At the January 9, 2025 Voters Assembly the gift received from the Donald Wahls estate was distributed as follows - 10% to Good Shepherd Lutheran School, 20% to the Endowment Fund and 70% to the General Fund. The Voters Assembly also approved a budget of \$360,921 of which \$50,000 was approved to refurbish the bathrooms in the parsonage. Approximately \$65,000 of General Fund reserves will be needed to fund the budget deficit.

Endowment Fund

At the end of 2024, the Endowment Fund balance was \$141,013 of which \$31,543 is available to distribute. In 2024, \$4,000 was distributed to: Christ Lutheran School in Streator - \$1,000; Camp Cilca 75th Anniversary - \$1,000; and LC-MS Disaster Relief - \$2,000. With the action taken at the January 9, 2025 Voters Assembly, \$11,200 will be moved to the Endowment Fund from the Donald Wahls estate bring the balance to \$153,213.

Let us give thanks to the Lord for his continued blessings and pray that we may continue to be faithful stewards until the day of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

From the Pastor's Desk

"Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word; For my eyes have seen your salvation that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, A light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel." Luke 2:29-32

Dear Members of Trinity,

Do the above verses seem familiar to you? They should, especially on a Communion Sunday, right? Our prayer in the Nunc Dimittis (Latin for "now you are letting") is for the Lord to allow us to "depart in peace" along with Simeon because we have beheld our salvation in the body and blood of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. These are also the words from the Gospel lesson for the Purification of Mary and the Presentation of our Lord observed on February 2nd.

Coming during Epiphany, always forty days after December 25 (February 2), this feast reminds that God is with us in the infant flesh of Jesus to be a sacrifice for our sins. As Mary obeys the law of her purification (Lev 12:6–8), Jesus is also presented at the temple as the firstborn to be redeemed (Ex 13:11–15). Jesus kept the law required of "the children," "his brothers," "in every respect" so that, as the Epistle for this day teaches, he could become our high priest and win the victory over death and the devil by his once-for-all-time sacrifice (Heb 2:14, 17).

I admit that I smile and chuckle a little bit when a visitor comes to Trinity on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day and they look at our Nativity Scene in room 10 and ask: "Why are the Wise Men so far away?" I usually answer quite simply "Because they haven't arrived yet!" When movies like "The Star" try to do all sorts of twists and turns in order that the angels, shepherds, wise men, and especially Jesus, Mary and Joseph all get to the manger at the same time, you may want to scratch your head.

But the feast that we celebrate on February 2nd (not Groundhog's Day) shows us that the Wise Men didn't arrive at Jesus' *house* (not stable) until at least 40 days after Jesus birth. Mary and Joseph were faithful to the Law on Jesus' behalf. When He was 8 days old, Jesus was circumcised even if he didn't need to be. He was "fulfilling all righteousness" by keeping the Law—including the ceremonial—even though He was the perfect Son of God. On His 40th day (Feb. 2nd) Joseph and Mary once again fulfilled the Law by coming to the temple to offer sacrifices (two turtledoves) for Mary's purification and to present Mary's first-born child and son.

While this particular feast day of the Church is not very well known in most Christian congregations, it is nevertheless important to note that Jesus (and His parents) "fulfilled all righteousness" from His birth until His death and resurrection. We rejoice with Simeon every time we gather at the Lord's Table and depart in peace. May we use those gifts that God so freely gives us as we enter each week into the mission field, and may we tell others of the marvelous thing that He has done.
